Isaiah 45:9 *“Woe to those who quarrel with their Maker, those who are nothing but potsherd among the potsherds on the ground. Does the clay say to the potter, ‘What are you making?’”*

In a blob of potter's clay, there exists the potential to become a priceless vase. There also exists the potential to be just an annoying blob, stuck to the side of someone's truck tire.

As Christians we can think of ourselves as that blob of potter's clay, and Jesus can be thought of as the potter.

What will we allow him to make of us?

His work in molding and shaping us is accomplished by means of thousands of nudges to our spirit. Often these nudges come directly from reading God's Word. Sometimes they come from other sources – such as Bible teachers, various videos, books, etc.

First, we need to keep in mind that, regardless of the source, God's nudges are **never** contrary to God's Written Word.

Second, we need to keep in mind that whatever emerges from that clay, is determined by our reactions to those thousands of nudges.

By resisting God's nudges, we can, as it were, remain an annoying 'stain on someone's truck tire' in this life - an unfortunate waste of potential. But if we yield to His Loving Intentions, He can fashion us into a masterpiece, an instrument to bring many to Christ.

May this be our prayer:

“Have thine own way, Lord, have thine own way,  
Thou art the master, I am the clay.  
Mold me and make me, after thy will,  
While I am waiting, yielded and still.”
